STOMP

For the last few years, one of our

Christmas traditions has been to enjoy a “family gift” – something that we can enjoy together. This year, when I saw that **STOMP** was coming to Grand Rapids, I wanted to go. I had seen it on TV before, but had never experienced it live. I figured that it would be a good thing for Ivan, Ana, Luka and me to see together.

What a show; what an experience! It was 105 minutes of non-stop action on the stage. The group of **8 performers** used so many different objects to make sound and rhythm: aluminum trash cans and lids, rubber pipes, shopping carts, brooms, Zippo lighters, and their hands and feet. It was such a cool thing to watch!

As I watched them work together, I couldn't help thinking that they offered a great image of the church as the Body of Christ. First of all, **they were different people**, each with their own unique look and personality. Some of that was part of the performance, but some of it was true to who they are.

Second, it was obvious that **they had different specialties** when it came to instruments. Not all of them performed in every part of the program, but all of them contributed to an amazing show. They performed many different rhythms and used many different gifts. I can't imagine the amount of energy it took to perform – let alone the time spent together to make it come together so well.

So as we look at a new year, I thought of words from **I Corinthians 12**:
There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds

of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

And words from a hymn called “**Many Gifts, One Spirit**” also came to mind:
Many gifts, one Spirit, one love known in many ways. In our difference is blessing, from diversity we praise one Giver, one Lord, one Word known in many ways, hallowing our days. For the Giver and the Gifts, praise, praise, praise.

Maybe you **know your spiritual gifts** and you're using them to serve God. Wonderful! If you don't, **take time to discover how God has gifted you to serve in specific ways**. It's a powerful tool as we grow as followers of Jesus and as a part of the Body of Christ. You can find a **21-question inventory** at:

Driven by his profound sadness and desire to understand his son better, he decides to embark on the 800 km historical pilgrimage, but soon discovers that he will not be alone on this journey. An unlikely quartet of misfits creates an everlasting bond, and Tom begins to learn what it means to be a citizen of the world again, and discovers the difference between "the life we live and the life we choose."

Synopsis: Our faith journey is our own, but it's lived out in community with others in the Body of Christ. In community, we learn more about God and God's love for us than we ever could alone, and we build trust in God who loves us just as we are.

Synopsis: In a time when “fake news” is on our minds and we're seeking truth, how do we use our faith and reason to love and serve God and witness to others?


Wed., Feb. 14, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.:

Ash Wednesday Worship at Central UMC

“Gifts of the Dark Wood”

This series, based on the book by the same name, is about “seeing life through new eyes, recognizing that experiences of failure, emptiness, and uncertainty are as critical for finding our way

through life as they are unavoidable.” We will see how experiences of life through the “dark wood” are actually clues to our “calling” or “life path.” How can the struggles of life be the seedbed of spiritual awakening to the fullness of life?



February 18, 2018: “The Gift of Uncertainty”

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 13: 11-12

Synopsis: When we allow ourselves to accept the journey within the Dark Wood, the Holy Spirit Guide tends to shake things up a bit as we awaken to nudgings toward a fuller life. But life is messy. Life is uncertain. Rather than a problem to be solved, what if we saw uncertainty as a gift helping us let go of all we cannot know so that we can live more wholeheartedly?

February 25, 2018: “The Gift of Emptiness”

Scripture: Luke 17:33; Proverbs 9:10; Psalm 22

Synopsis: Many of us sometimes feel empty inside and we fear that there is nothing there of worth. But what if we let go of our obsession with worthiness and released into the idea that if we want to be filled – to find God – getting empty is the best way. God will find us! In our journey this Lent toward the Cross, we know even Jesus felt empty despair...and it was at this moment that God's possibility of life beyond that pain was revealed.


