A message from Kate Robbins and our Children's Christian Education Team:

Children are important to God and to our church! The presence of children in worship is not only a gift, but a visual reminder that we're growing. In May, we're creating an area at the front of the sanctuary where families with babies and toddlers to worship together called a **"Grace Space."** It's a space for families with children ages 3 and under to engage in age-appropriate activities (soft, quiet toys and seats) while experiencing worship in the sanctuary. It's not intended to replace nursery, but to give parents and caregivers an additional option.

Sometimes adults wonder why families want little children with them in church. Think of it like this: bringing children into the sanctuary is like letting them eat at the dinner table. Even though their manners are far from elegant, the hope is that, given time, they'll feel like part of the family.

We're really excited for this space, and it's our hope that everyone will value it and the unspoken love and grace that it offers. This can be an important space and sign of welcome for first-time visitors, too.

April Worship News by Karen Booth & Vicki Zuker

April 1, 2018: "Where We Go from Here"

Scripture: Mark 16: 1-7

Synopsis: The story of all those who surrounded Jesus parallels our own failures, fears, and missteps. Where do we go from here? We journey into our fullness, continuing to embrace the Gifts of the Dark Wood where the Spirit beckons us into extraordinary life.

"Witness"

In our United Methodist membership vows, "witness" was added in 2009. The change came because the vows of "prayers, presence, gifts and service" were primarily inwardly focused and institutional in character. They offered little insight or inspiration for disciples of Jesus Christ to engage in God's mission of transforming the world. Adding "witness" helps us to recognize our responsibilities not only to "show up," but to "show forth" God's saving love in all that we do.

During this four week series, you'll have an opportunity to create a group "vision board" for how we can witness to our faith. A vision board uses words, phrases or quotes, and images to convey an idea. The worship team will begin the board with the words witness, authenticity, humility, integrity, and unity then add pictures of people being witnesses for Christ. Some examples



might include youth on a mission trip, members serving at a funeral luncheon, Trustees working to keep our building welcoming, volunteers packing lunches for Kids' Food Basket, Scouts serving neighbors, and more. Please consider printing out one or two pictures and sharing them during this series. You can also share a quote or verse. If you'd like your contribution back when the board comes down in mid-May, please write your name or attach a mailing label on the back of the picture.

April 8, 2018: "Authenticity"

Scripture: 1 John 1:1-2:2

Synopsis: People are looking for authentic relationships where there is honesty, trust, and loyalty. Our witness to the risen Christ should offer the same to those we encounter.

April 15, 2018: "Humility"

Scripture: 1 John 3:1-7

Synopsis: The word "humility" comes from the Latin word for "of the dust." What does it mean to be grounded in our faith and aware of God's holiness and our humanity?

April 22, 2018: "Integrity"

Scripture: 1 John 3:16-24

Synopsis: It's an old adage, but "actions speak more loudly than words." "Walking the walk" is more important than simply "talking the talk." Faith lived out in action is a powerful and expected response to the love of Jesus in our lives.

April 29, 2018 at 9 AM: "Unity"

Scripture: 1 John 4:7-21

Synopsis: Our faith in the resurrection of Jesus brings us together and calls us together to be the presence of Christ in the world. How do we show God's "perfect love that casts out fear" in the midst of so much division in our world?

April 29, 2018 at 11 AM: Worship at Crestwood UMC

Scripture: Colossians 3: 11-17; John 17: 20-23

Holy Communion will be celebrated. Lunch will be provided after worship.
