Grace Space: This month we'll begin welcoming families with young children into our Grace Space. Located in the front of the sanctuary, this space is for families with children ages 3 and under to engage in age-appropriate activities (soft, quiet toys and seats) while experiencing worship.

Children giggle, poke, and move simply because they're children. But they also sing, pray, and give alongside us. Here are ways we can remember to accept and value children's restlessness during worship, trusting that they are also learning:

- that it's important to come to this place each Sunday,
- that they belong to this special company of people,
- that the sights and sounds and feelings in the sanctuary are good, and
- that something is expected of them in this place, and that they may respond in song, in prayer, in praise, and in offering.

Bringing a child to church can be a real exercise in patience. But, then again, so are many other facets of caring for kids, and the rewards are well worth the effort! While we don't want our children to be disruptive or hamper worship, we affirm that children are a part of the church and should be among the worshipping people. They may not participate in the same way adults do, but they are growing in understanding and learning to take their place in the church family.

The presence of children is a gift, and they remind us that our church is growing. They're a treasured part of this faith family, and their noise and action are a natural part of their presence among us. The way we welcome children directly affects the way they respond to the Church, God, and one another. Let them know they are at home in this house of worship. Please welcome them and give a smile of encouragement to their parents.
