Gratitude and thankfulness – that’s what comes to mind for me as we turn the page from October to November. It’s a season of counting blessings and giving thanks for God’s gifts in our lives. I count all of you as one of mine.

Thank you for your cards and kind words during Pastor Appreciation Month. Thanks to the Tuesday morning Bible study for the gift certificate and to the MNO team for providing delicious meals throughout the month. It’s really a blessing and a gift!

Pastor Appreciation Month is a fairly new “Hallmark holiday” – only established in 1992. It started as a way to encourage pastors, missionaries, and others whose vocation is ministry. (That’s really all of us because we’re all ministers of the Gospel, but you get the idea!)

I certainly feel appreciated, and **I especially want to thank you for your prayers for me and my family.** Pastors don’t serve alone; our families are a part of our ministry. Thank you for supporting me and Ivan, Ana, and Luka. Knowing that you pray for us is a special blessing. It matters, and I’m deeply grateful.

This year, November also means mid-term elections. **I hope that you’re registered to vote and that you’ll exercise your right to vote.** I offer words from John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement in England in the 1700’s. We might call them his “three simple rules” for voting - from **October 6, 1774:**

- I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them*
- 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy**
 - 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and**

3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.”

I’m challenged by Wesley’s words and will take them to heart as I vote next week. I also offer you **words from our Social Principles:**

While our allegiance to God takes precedence over our allegiance to any state, we acknowledge the vital function of government as a principal vehicle for the ordering of society. Because we know ourselves to be responsible to God for social and political life, we declare the following relative to governments...

Political Responsibility

The strength of a political system depends upon the full and willing participation of its citizens. The church should continually exert a strong ethical influence upon the state, supporting policies and programs deemed to be just and opposing policies and programs that are unjust.

November 2018 – “Grief”

Grief is both the most common and the most individual human experience. Everybody grieves losses, and yet we don't grieve in the same way. More and more, we're discovering **the complicated dynamics of grief and the reality that grief isn't a problem to be solved, but a journey to be lived.** The month of November challenges us to live in the tension of life and death. We remember the saints and hear the call to live faithfully. We see the change of season and give thanks for the blessings of life. We live knowing that death is sure, but so is the promise of eternal life. How do we grieve with hope, be with one another in grief, and trust in God's good care for us?

November 4, 2018: “Living in Two Worlds”

Scripture: John 11: 17-36; Revelation 21: 1-6a

Synopsis: As we celebrate the lives of the saints – those who have helped us to know God better – we live in two worlds. We are bound to eternity by love for God and others, especially those who have died and whom we remember, and we're called to share that love here and now.

November 11, 2018: “Compassionate Companions Needed”

Scripture: Job 2: 11-13; Romans 12: 9-15

Synopsis: Jesus said, “Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.” In times of grief, God in Christ is our most compassionate companion, but that's difficult to understand if we're not surrounded by people who demonstrate God's care to us. We can't “fix” the problem of grief, even though we want to. Instead, how do we learn to be people who suffer with others (compassion) and offer sustenance (companionship) for the journey?

Scripture: I Thessalonians 5: 12-24

Synopsis: Grieving can lead to deeper despair if we try to deny our feelings, make the journey on our own, or trust that it will “just get better” with time. We can experience true healing and hope in the midst of grief when we turn to God and open ourselves to God's grace and peace.


