You may have heard about **Marie Kondo**. She is an author. Her book *The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying Up: The Japanese Art of Decluttering and Organizing* was translated into English in 2014 and became a bestseller in the U.S. I learned about her as I was looking at Netflix, and her series, *Tidying Up with Marie Kondo*, popped up in the “Popular on Netflix” category. I was intrigued, and I watched some of the show.

Kondo goes into homes and invites people to “tidy up” by asking if items spark joy in their lives. If they do, they keep them, but if not, it’s time to give them away. Her method has been credited with an increase in donations, and many people have taken her advice to heart.

“Tidying Up” may be a good way to think about the season of Lent. Traditionally, Lent was a time for people to prepare for baptism into the Christian faith. Now it’s a time to prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter, including repenting of sin and seeking God’s forgiveness.

We tend to be more attuned to spiritual works in this season, and **there’s something about committing to 40 days of “giving up” or “taking on” that’s transformative.** Some use the terms “feast on” and “fast from.” **Whatever we do, the intentional work is meant to keep our focus on Jesus** – his life, ministry, suffering, and death, so that we come to Easter ready to live into the joy of resurrection.

And **it starts on Ash Wednesday** when we acknowledge that we are mortal – and that we need God’s grace and mercy. I’ll be sharing more specific ways to live into Lent, but I wanted to offer this **prayer for Ash Wednesday** by Robert P. Fugarino, which has become important to me:

*Lord, all year we try to avoid dust and ash.
Dust is the homes we have failed to clean and our
broken dreams long abandoned.*

*Ash is the world engulfed in flames and ancient
bodies in unmarked graves.*

*Lord, all year we try to avoid dust and ash, but
here we are. And here you are. And it is
Wednesday. And we face reality.*

*And you insist dust and ash be pressed to our
flesh.*

*We are fragile failures one day to be scorched by
fire and snacked on by worms.*

*Yet when it becomes too heavy, you whisper in our
ears true things that are also sweet:*

*“It was into dust and ash I breathed and you
awoke.”*

*Breathe again, Lord, and command us fragile
failures to walk on.*

*Lord, let us remember it all — dust and ash, death
and deliverance, And especially you. Amen.*

(https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OsMyv9Q4_OU) Growing up in Greenville, Texas, Bart Millard suffers physical and emotional abuse at the hands of his father, Arthur. When Arthur becomes terminally ill, he finds redemption by embracing his faith and rediscovering his love for his son. Years later, Bart’s troubled childhood and mended relationship with his dad inspires him to write the hit song, “I Can Only Imagine,” as singer of the Christian band Mercy Me. The song brings ultimate hope to so many and is a gripping reminder of the power of true forgiveness. *Scripture:* II Corinthians 5: 11-21; Acts 9: 1-21 *Synopsis:* God is in the business of reconciliation – bringing people together and leading us back to the truth of God’s love for us. We bank on hope – that God can and will work through the toughest situations we face and even provide us glimpses of God’s Grace in our struggles.

“Shadow Savior: Not the Savior You Want, but the Savior You Need”

Sometimes we’re not very brave when it comes to faith. We don’t want to ask the questions that keep coming up for us. We don’t want to seem like we don’t believe or that we struggle. And yet, sometimes “because the Bible says so” or “well, Jesus said it” isn’t enough. We need to be honest about our wonderings and questions. **What do we find difficult about Jesus?** During his life and ministry and then into the week of his crucifixion, Jesus’ closest followers and many who surrounded him struggled to understand and accept all that he said and did, and we might, too. But when we share our confusion, anger, fear, frustration, and surprise, we’ll find even more

reason to follow the One who comes to save.

March 10, 2019: “When Jesus Confuses You”

Scripture: Matthew 22: 15-22

Synopsis: We want living our faith to be easy, but following Jesus isn’t easy, especially as we encounter competing allegiances.

March 17, 2019: “When Jesus Angers You”

Scripture: Matthew 21: 12-17

Synopsis: Jesus wasn’t a “quiet” presence among the people. He disrupted the status quo when it didn’t honor God and people and considers our motives when it comes to worship and faith.

March 24, 2019: “When Jesus Disappoints You”

Scripture: Matthew 26: 14-16

Synopsis: Not everyone liked Jesus or thought he was doing what the promised Messiah should do. Judas and others expected a mighty warrior who would show power against the Romans, not someone who would suffer and die at their hand. Perhaps we still struggle to accept Jesus as he is – not as we want him to be.

March 31, 2019: “When Jesus Scares You”

Synopsis: The humanity of Jesus can scare us. Jesus, God incarnate, experienced separation from God.
