
*You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies.
You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.
Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.*

I looked online to see if there was anything in the news about the lost sheep and the rescuers. I never found anything, but I hope that the sheep is safe back in familiar surroundings.

Even looking at it from the sidelines, I could relate to the sense of confusion and fear. I've been there before, and maybe you have, too. I feel

some sense of it in the church amid differing viewpoints about human sexuality. But I know we've felt it at other times, too. When life throws us for a loop, when we're disoriented or uncertain about what's next, when we're overwhelmed, when we're scared...

I wonder if that's why this psalm is so well-loved. **We need a shepherd to guide us, stand with us, correct us when we get off course, gather us into community, and most of all, love us.** We need the assurance of love that doesn't ever give up on us. Maybe we're a little like that sheep on the side of the downtown street – in need of help and saving.



As we continue to walk with Jesus, our Shadow Savior, I pray that we'd know the deep, deep love of God for each of us. I pray that we share that love in a world so hungry for it.

Scripture: Matthew 26: 31-35

Synopsis: Jesus knows our humanity well and knows the reality of betrayal. He knows the depths of our hearts and our propensity for self-preservation. How do we open our hearts to God and seek forgiveness for turning away from Jesus in our midst?

April 14, 2019: "When Jesus Surprises You"

Scripture: Matthew 21: 1-11

Synopsis: Jesus' triumphal entry wasn't very "triumphant" at all, except for the fact that he was fulfilling the prophesy of Zechariah. Coming into Jerusalem on a donkey rather than a horse was a sign of who he was and how he would rule as King. Jesus continues to surprise us a "the man who would be king" coming in humility and peace.

Thurs., April 18, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.: "When Jesus Tells You What to Do"

Scripture: Matthew 26: 17-30, John 13: 1-17

Synopsis: Jesus embodies the love he asks us to share in sharing the Last Supper and washing his disciples' feet. Even as we know what's ahead, how do we hear him and follow his way?

Join us for a potluck style meal at 6:15 p.m. at the back of the sanctuary. Scripture: Matthew 28: 1-10

Synopsis: Jesus' crucifixion isn't the end of the story, and his saving work doesn't end at the cross. We don't just sit in awe at resurrection either. The joy of salvation is lived out when we go and tell (and show) others about it. The reality of resurrection isn't something to keep to ourselves, but something to share.

April 28, 2019: "When Jesus Tells You to Go and Keep Going"

Scripture: Matthew 28: 16-20

Synopsis: The disciples respond in worship and with doubt when they see the risen Jesus. He gives them the Great Commission – to go, baptize, and teach. They are sent out beyond their home and comfort to share Good News with the assurance of Jesus’ presence – God with us.

Most of us may remember being told "stop doing that!" as children. Whether at home or school or somewhere else, we’re often told what NOT to do. As parents and caregivers, we may find ourselves saying, "Stop it!" or redirecting behavior often.

As we seek to be faithful to Jesus, we may be the ones hearing "Stop it!" in order for the Good News of God’s love to be clearer to the world.
