Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

This greeting has been shared for centuries as we celebrate the joy of Easter. How do we live as Easter people?



I love this quote from writer Frederick Buechner. I'll be attending, and Jason Colella will attend as our Lay Member to Annual Conference. I'm grateful for Jason's gifts to serve in this important role, including reading through a lot of information! Please pray for Jason and me, all of the delegates, and Bishop David Bard.

Annual Conference is always full of worship, fellowship, and discussion, and I want to share two important things that will happen this year:

1. The election of lay and clergy delegates for the 2020 General Conference in Minneapolis, MN
2. The service of ordination and commissioning on Sunday, June 2

Kim Bos, who has been a part of our congregation since her teenage years, is among those who will be commissioned (the step before ordination). We celebrate with Kim, her husband, Wil, and her family. Kim has been appointed to serve as the Director of the Wesley Foundation at Ferris State University in Big Rapids, MI.

I know the importance of a supportive “home church” in the journey to ordained ministry, and I'm grateful that Lake Harbor UMC has been a part of that support for Kim and others.


