First, thank you for the Christmas cards that we received from many of you. Those greetings mean a lot to us. I also want to thank you for the love gift. We use it for family time and vacation over the next year, and it's a special blessing to us! We're grateful to serve God with you and excited for how the Holy Spirit is moving at Lake Harbor as we make disciples!

I'm deeply grateful that we serve God as a team at Lake Harbor. We have a dedicated and gifted group of staff and servant-leaders who support and enhance our mission and vision:

There's a lot of information available online, and I hope you'll take some time to read it and pray for our greater UMC as we engage in deeper conversation about human sexuality. Bishop Bard has offered conversations about "A Way Forward" around the state, and we're joining with other Muskegon-area UMCs on Tues.,

January 29 from 6:30-8:00 p.m. at Community

UMC in North Muskegon to share information and try to answer questions. Again, this isn't designed to be a time for debate, but a time to explain the process and pray for our larger UMC.

In the meantime, I offer words from theologian Howard Thurman that are important to me in the Christmas season (and all year long!):

The Work of Christmas

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

"Won't You Be My Neighbor? Learning from Mister Rogers" Fred Rogers, "Mister Rogers," is one of the most recognizable figures in children's television. 2018 was the 50th anniversary of the first airing of "Mister

Rogers' Neighborhood," which brought a renewed interest in his work and his life. Rogers was also a professing Christian and an ordained Presbyterian pastor. His faith showed through his commitment to teaching and caring for children.

As we live into the season of Epiphany, when we celebrate that Jesus is born to be Savior to all and to show God's love to everyone, how does Mister Rogers challenge us to hear that message? As we enter a New Year and new worship theme "Love God and love neighbor," how can looking at Scripture, with the help of Mister Rogers, guide us in our walk as disciples of Jesus Christ?

January 6, 2019: "Loving Ourselves, Loving Our Neighbor"

Scripture: I Corinthians 13: 1-13; Matthew 22: 36-40

<u>Synopsis:</u> We are created in the image of God and are of sacred worth. When Jesus talks of loving God and loving our neighbor as we love ourselves, he calls us to claim the truth of God's love for us personally. How do we allow it to shape our selfimage and our interactions with others?

January 13, 2019: "Please Won't You Be My Neighbor?"

<u>Scripture</u>: Romans 15: 1-17; Matthew 5: 43-48 <u>Synopsis</u>: This is an invitation into a relationships of mutual caring – and a tough sell in today's world. We've become more insular and isolated, so do we really mean it? Now we live more in neighborhoods than we do with neighbors, but the call is still to care for one another – even those we would call our enemies.

January 20, 2019: "In Some Ways We Are Different"

<u>Scripture:</u> Micah 6: 6-8; I Corinthians 12: 12-27 <u>Synopsis:</u> Diversity is a vital part of the Body of Christ and of our community and world. Mister Rogers was prophetic and brave in how he lifted up others. How do we celebrate our uniqueness as beloved children of God and see justice for those who are oppressed?

January 27, 2019: "Who Is My Neighbor? Or Look for the Helpers"

Scripture: Luke 10: 25-37

<u>Synopsis:</u> Jesus tells us that a neighbor is anyone in need. He calls us to know that deep down so we can respond as a neighbor. How are we living out the call to be a helper where we are?

Every time we host guests from Family Promise, I think about



As we enter 2019, I am humbled and inspired by what God has done through our community and filled with expectation at what God will do in the coming year!


