

November Worship News by Karen Booth & Vicki Zuker

“Why?”

Most of us struggle with the question of “why?” at one time or another. Whether it’s the pain of death, our own life situation or someone else close to us, whether it’s an overwhelming global problems like hunger and violence, or whether it’s the reality that some people have faced hardship that we cannot imagine, we want to know why things happen the way they do. And our faith plays a role, too. We’re forced to confront what we believe about God, what is true about God, and how that fits together or doesn’t. This series will challenge us to ask the hard questions and hopefully find some answers.

November 3, 2019: “God and Suffering”

Scripture: Job 1: 20-22, 42: 1-8; John 11: 32-37

Synopsis: Suffering is a human experience and always raises spiritual questions. From Job to Jesus, grief is a touch point of suffering and a time when we ask, “Why?” How do we view suffering for what it is – not God’s doing – but a part of being human and living life with the promise of God’s presence and care? Today we’ll remember loved ones who have passed since November 1, 2018.



November 10, 2019: “Unanswered Prayers”

Scripture: Matthew 21: 18-22; Psalm 22; John 15: 1-8; Luke 22: 39-46

Synopsis: Prayer is not an exercise in getting what we want, but in nurturing a relationship with God through both speaking and listening. We struggle when God doesn’t answer prayers in the way we assume is best for us, but that doesn’t mean God isn’t attentive and faithful.

November 17, 2019: “God’s Will for Your Life”

Scripture: Colossians 1: 9-14; Romans 12: 1-2; Matthew 6: 7-13; Psalm 139

Synopsis: We pray “Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done” often, but how do we understand our place in it? Looking at the bigger and longer story of God’s love and redemption, we are a part of that

story as we journey with God and pay attention to God’s prompting in our lives.

Monday, November 18, 2019: GriefShare

“Surviving the Holidays” at 6:30 p.m. in the Lounge.



November 24, 2019: “Love Wins”

Scripture: Psalm 23; Romans 8: 26-28, 31-32, 35, 37-39; II Corinthians 4:16-5:1; Revelation 21: 1-7

Synopsis: God’s presence with us in sorrow and joy and God’s work through us to bring healing and hope are a promise for us to claim and a witness to God’s victory over suffering and death. Even our suffering can be transformed when we offer it to God just as Jesus’ death was transformed into the Good News of God’s love for the world.




