- Change needed to revitalize the Methodist Church. Change is challenging, but I believe needed to bring young adults raised by parents who stopped attending church to the practicing faith family. (Jean Kelly)
- In the news: Racism. Black Lives Matter. Protests or Riots? Social justice. Connection to the Beatle's song, "Revolution." The total amount of news and its negativity can overwhelm us. Attacks on religious freedom.
- How to stay sane until the November elections is over.
- Don't forget the invisibles the childless, the never married, etc. the demographic that doesn't fit a typical niche in a family centered church.
- Reaction to "invisibles" from Jean Kelly: Not sure what is meant by not fitting a typical niche in a family centered church. Although those factors are disappointments to me in my life, have tried to be a very good Aunt and an active person in the church family. It makes me sad to be thought of as "invisible" Not sure how to process that. I do see churches as family centered the family of god. All God's children, each with their own joys, sorrows, talents, and challenges in this life. Inclusion, which I think is something LHUMC does well, is probably a better label for this topic.
- Continue to tackle the hard stuff. Seekers don't want the fluff, they want to hear and see
 that we are doing the hard work around hot issues. Maybe having some anti-racism classes
 offered at church. Some resources are listed under "series ideas" below. Brave Conversation
 small group formation.
- Politics of Jesus: Jesus was/is political, not partisan. How is that related to righteous indignation?
- I struggle greatly, at this time, with those who call themselves Christians and continue to hold on to their racist beliefs and attitudes. It's hard not to judge, but yet if we do, we are as bad as they are. I struggle with a president who speaks and acts in such un-Christian ways and I struggle so much with understanding why good people, close friends, Christian friends support him. To be willing to be open and listen and try to work to bring people together is a huge challenge, yet it's what God asks us to do. The problem is some of us do not want to come together. We would rather be right. The struggles continue. My desire is, of course, an end to all the madness, and a world where all will be willing to work and live in peace.

- One of the Spoken needs that has come up in my family is the deep divide with politics among the family. It is there between my siblings as well as among our large extended family - not sure how we will reconcile to ever have another reunion following the November election. (Jean Kelly)

Unspoken Needs

Series Ideas

Just not the usuals- the multiple Marys, Martha, Elizabeth, Esther, Hagar, Ruth, Naomi, etc. or women in the usual roles- wife of, daughter of, sister of. Women who were their own person. Related series: Female Prophets – Deborah, Huldah, Noadiah, Miriam, Abigail, Anna, Hannah

Anti-Racism (The Work We Need to Do). Jesus wasn't a white man. White fragility. Not saying anything is complacent. Resources: https://www.wgvu.org/shaping-narratives/, https://ethnicdiversity.org/, https://ethnicdiversity.org/<

*God's People: A Biblical Response to Racism. Breaking down the walls of racism has to be an intentional act. We need to love with purpose because only God's love will break racism down.

Series with an asterisk (*) indicate that the idea is from churchsermonseries.com.

- Related top: Learn about Tu B'Av, the Jewish holiday of love, perhaps with a speaker from the synagogue.

Our New World!? God Is Still There for Us!

*Our New Normal. God is with us in the disorienting situations we find ourselves in whether due to a global pandemic, a new stage of life of our own choosing, or a sudden change by chance, we discover new rhythms of life.

What Are You Doing for God? Spreading His Word. Living the Word. Doing for Others.

God's Forgiveness. We are saved by grace, but still judged when we die.

Beguiled by Beauty by Marcia McFee. In this worship series we will dwell with the God of Divine Goodness, deeply in love with us, and practice ways to return that love as we fall more

deeply in love with creation and with one another.

Mission Month

- * On a Mission Every Day. We are not talking about a trip, not an organization, not something just happening in another country, but something that happens whenever, wherever YOU are... Related resource: A Field Guide for Everyday Mission: 30 Days and 101 Ways by Benn Connelly and Bo Roberts
- * Sending the Saints. Paul's letter to the church in Philippi carries a lasting message that encourages and mobilizes the church, even today. What does it take to be a saint? Are you a saint?
- * **Soul Detox**. Every day, we are faced with "pollution" that threatens our faith by defining our emotions and our behaviors. Ultimately these toxins may damage our relationship with God. What are these toxins that assault us, even subconsciously, on a daily basis? What is necessary for us to do to remain clean, pure, and focused on God's holiness?
- * Empowered. (Pentecost...The Holy Spirit, The Comforter has Come...) This series "challenges our faith to use this gift of the Holy Spirit. What did Jesus promise us about the Spirit? In what ways are we suing the spirit that God has poured out?

Systemic theology – heaven, hell, born again

The Elephant in the Room: Something that will take us into General Conference. The United Methodist's stand on gay issues. What is our response to people who quote the bible regarding homosexuality? If you say you believe in the bible, period, how can you then pick and choose what you believe? I know where I stand, but does that mean I am a "bible picker"? God knew us

before we were formed and he doesn't make mistakes, so what does God expect of me that I don't already know?

We All Have a Story to Tell – Hearing from members about how they started going to church. What moved them?
