


Holy Thursday, April 1 at 7:00 p.m.:

“The Garden at Night: Watch and Pray”

Scripture: Mark 14: 12-26, 32-41

Character focus: The Garden

Synopsis: Jesus offers grace to his disciples even as he warns them of betrayal. Jesus takes them to pray even as they struggle to stay awake. Jesus displays agape love even as he prays and recognizes his humanity in going to the cross to bring salvation. We gather with him in honest confession as we “sit with our sin” and ask for forgiveness.



“Are We There Yet?”

Easter is a season when we celebrate resurrection and the call to live as people who claim new life and have hope in Christ. Spending time focusing on the **Sermon on the Mount** where Jesus starts with words of blessing challenges us to understand blessing more fully – not simply as a gift or reward, but as a way of living the Kingdom of God. *Are we there yet?*



Prayer Vigil starting at 8:30 p.m.:

Offer the gift of time to God in prayer – for ourselves, our church, community, and world, and especially concerns gathered up for the vigil that might never be shared in worship.

Good Friday, April 2 at 12:00 p.m.:

“Were You There?”

Scripture: Mark 14:53-15:47

Synopsis: Recounting Jesus’ suffering and death may be the part we don’t want to face, but we need to see ourselves in the whole story of God’s grace and love shown at the cross.

Easter Sunday, April 4:

“The Garden at Dawn: A Hopeful Vision”

Scripture: John 20: 11-18; Genesis 2: 8-10, 15; Revelation 22: 1-3

Character focus: The Garden

Synopsis: Resurrection calls us to claim hope that is always with us as people whose faith is in Jesus Christ. God offers a hopeful vision for new life right now and eternal life in God’s love and care.

April 11: “Upside-Down Blessings”

Scripture: Matthew 5: 1-12

Synopsis: We live in a world inundated with message about what “the Good Life” is, which can leave us with mixed messages when it comes to living faithfully. The Beatitudes serve as a way of getting our bearings as to how God operates, what God values, and where the “good life” is truly found.

April 18: “You Make a Difference!”

Scripture: Matthew 5: 13-20

Synopsis: We’re called to be difference-makers – just like salt and light make a difference. How do we reflect the nature of God our King and his Kingdom?

April 25: “Hard Words from Jesus”

Scripture: Matthew 5: 21-48; Exodus 20

Synopsis: Jesus invites us to envision and enter into a way of living that is different from the world around us. The Ten Commandments are the foundation for this new life, but we also have to reorder our desires. And to do that, we have to rely on the power of God.

So far this year, we've focused on **ending human trafficking, healing political divisions, and understanding our own bias.** In April, our focus will be **Creation Care and Environmental Stewardship.** How do we care for God's creation and take seriously God's call to be faithful stewards of all that God has made? It was a really great experience and an opportunity to share some of the great things that we have done in the past, as well as how we're dealing with the current restrictions and limitations and doing ministry in our new normal.

Our work during the Summit was focused on Building a Disciple Making Movement. Basically, how do we help someone move from "Unbelief" to "Maturity in Faith"? It was a great discussion in break out groups filled with people from all over the world who are experiencing different things and have vastly different approaches. We looked at many different discipleship models and discussed what has and hasn't worked in the past. In the end, we didn't all agree on the best way to make disciples, but we did all agree that we are called to do just that, and if we truly answer that call, we will empower others to do it, too.

This is what we do every day at Lake Harbor UMC: We Welcome All! We are Empowered by Christ! We are Sent forth to Serve! We are making, Equipping, and Empowering Disciples! Then we are sending them out to make more disciples, and the cycle continues!

We ended our time with prayer and many people prayed in different languages as God spoke to our hearts in the universal language of Love! It was a very moving experience!



The Return to Something Different

When Lord, when? I have heard this cry more often this past year than I would want to in a lifetime. *When are we going back? When will it be like before?* Those now seemingly distant days when we could cram as many rambunctious 5th graders in a Sunday School classroom in a basement as the building could structurally withstand, and think nothing of it except for how to clean up some juice.

When? When we could travel. Or shop. Or pop in and see someone. Even the little things. See actual smiles on strangers.

I have been thinking and praying on this for some time now and wondering how our sisters and

brothers from years or centuries past processed what God was doing in their midst, in their time. Did those in exile ask similar questions? Or those scattered among the Roman world? These questions and how one would trace this throughout Judeo-Christian history would be best served through Bible study, discussion and sermons, but it is against this backdrop that I have found a counter-intuitive hope...

Maybe we're not going to go back to normal. At least not completely. And maybe that is a good thing.

When I take a mental and spiritual inventory of where we are and have been, the lump in my throat longing for what was forms alongside a swelling in my heart on what is, on what we have learned and become even thus far:


- We call each other more.
- We appreciate the workers at Walgreen's, and Meijer, and Amazon, a lot more than we used to.
- We value main street, small business and collectively can't wait to support that local restaurant.
- We will never take live arts, athletics, and other events for granted again.
- We see God's light in darkness a little more clearly.
- We know that we as a church can adapt and change and keep caring for one another, in whatever ways our situations dictate.

I am completely convinced that God is truly working along the lines echoed in Isaiah 43, "**Behold I am doing a new thing.**" I know this to the bottom of my soul because I see this. I hear this. God's people have not grown weary (even though I think we are all feeling that many times). God is making us into a new thing, always has, but maybe we see it a bit more of late.

I am also completely convinced that I personally have not a clue what God is actually doing with all this. This is a much bigger and grander story than

any one person could grasp. There is a humility that comforts me in this. When Lillian's grandchildren sit in a Bible Study (you know, after beaming up to their space station or parking their flying cars), they will look back to the crucible that was 2020 (and is 2021) and see how God made something new, and it was beautiful.

As I am enjoying now and looking forward to more of the days when seeing people, in church, at home, in assisted living becomes more like normal, I also remain hopeful and grateful of the work God has done, and will continue doing. *Behold God is doing a new thing!*

The next major project on our list is to replace windows in our building. We are in the process of getting a second quote to replace all of them. We have received one bid that comes with a lifetime warranty, but are reaching out to another company for a bid. More to come!

We are also planning to replace all valves in our boiler system that allows us more flexibility controlling the temperature in our building remotely. The current ones are quite old, and it is getting harder to find replacements for them.

We are in the planning stages of getting quotes to update our two bathrooms in the sanctuary. This project is long overdue. We will keep you posted!
