REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR MARY IVANOV:

Christmas and New Year greetings from my family to ours! Thanks to our Worship Connections Team for creating a great space for our 2021 picture. **Ivan, Ana, Luka, and I wish you hope, peace, joy, and love – and give thanks for the ways we experience them through you.** Thank you for Christmas cards and kind notes, delicious treats, special gifts, and generous love gift from our congregation. We are deeply grateful for your encouragement, support, and care as we worship, pray, study, serve, give, and share together as a community

of faith. It's a blessing to journey with you as we seek to be disciples and make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

The focus for the new year is **discipleship** – and **the practices that form us as disciples of Jesus Christ.** I'll be focusing on discipleship with you, but in a little different way. I'm taking a short **renewal leave in January 2022** approved last summer in conversation with our Staff-Parish Relations Committee and Administrative Council. I'll be attending some meetings as needed and leading Tuesday morning Bible study during the month, but I won't be preaching for four weeks. I'm thankful for those who will share God's word and message with you – and for a congregation that supports its pastor in taking time to renew her spirit. I won't be in the office on a regular basis, but will be available for pastoral care emergencies.

Some of my time will be spent on **continuing education** in Non Profit Church Leadership. So far, I've completed two courses – one on Stewardship and one on Human Resources. I'll start another course in January, and I'm working on an applied project focused on our congregation's role as steward of the large gift made to the Community Foundation of Muskegon. Part of this project has been the process of creating policy on how we'll receive and use undesignated gifts. I'll continue to work on how we deepen our practice of stewardship as disciples and as a community of faith. I have an extended meeting in January, including a presentation to prepare and time away with colleagues in the same program.


I'm also hoping to catch up on some reading, attend January Series lectures, visit family and friends, cook more often, and focus on my daily walk with Jesus. I'll be worshiping weekly (visiting my clergy colleagues), keeping up with Bible study, and taking time to serve, including starting to read at Ross Park Elementary. I'm looking forward to this time of learning, rest, and renewal, and I appreciate your support.

The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life

How do we walk with Christ – daily follow him, grow in him, and faithfully serve him? Discover five essential spiritual practices rooted in Jesus' own walk with God. In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it in their writings. And the Church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life. In each chapter, Hamilton explores one of these practices – each of which is intended to be part of our daily walk with Christ – its New Testament foundation, and its potential effect on our personal lives and our lives together as the church. January 2, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. with Brad Hilleary: “Worship and Prayer: A Living Hallelujah”

Scripture: Psalm 95: 1-7; Revelation 4: 8-11

Synopsis: Worshiping regularly with gratitude and nurturing our prayer life is a vital part of walking with Jesus. Worship is our witness that God is worthy of our praise. Prayer fosters an intimate connection and relationship with God.

January 9, 2022 at 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. with Jim Post: “Study: The Importance of Listening and Paying Attention”

Scripture: II Timothy 3: 14-17; Psalm 119: 105; Selected passages from Exodus

Synopsis: Listening is an important skill we hone, and listening to God's voice is no exception. God speaks to us in many ways, including general revelation (nature, art, life experiences, people, conscience, intuition, reason) and special revelation (Holy Spirit, Scripture, Jesus as God's Word to us).

January 16, 2022 at 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. with Jeff Verry: “Serve: Here I Am, Lord, Send Me”

Scripture: Micah 6: 6-8; John 13: 1-17

Synopsis: The call to follow Jesus is fundamentally a call to service, which we do both individually and together in our church.

January 23, 2022 at 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. with Mike Layman: “Give: Where Your Treasure Is”

Scripture: Matthew 6: 19-24; Luke 6: 38; Acts 20: 32-35

Synopsis: The way we spend our money is a kind of “selfie” that shows us our priorities and identifies gratitude and generosity as keys to live a good life. Jesus calls us to invest in God's kingdom rather than possessions.

January 30, 2022 at 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. with Pastor Mary: “Share: Going Fishing, Reflecting Light”

Scripture: Matthew 4: 18-25; Matthew 5: 13-16; II Corinthians 5: 16-21; I Peter 3: 15-16

Synopsis: We are called to bear witness to Christ by sharing our faith with others, which we do by letting our light shine and by using words to tell people what Jesus means to us.

Please take note of our **safety protocols for in-person worship** (approved by Administrative Council in December): We ask that **everyone, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask while coming in and out of the sanctuary or moving around in the building. Once seated, individuals may remove their masks if they wish.** We continue to recommend that those who are not fully vaccinated wear a mask at all times. **Please complete a check-in form and maintain distancing between households.**





From our Trustees

The updating of our boiler system is officially complete with new valves were installed and new thermostats that will maintain our temperature and can be adjusted remotely through wifi. That's a big change for us.

In December, we had new carpeting installed in the parsonage in the upper level. When we did our yearly walk through it was determined that we needed to do some updating there, and we now have a plan to start making that happen. We are also on schedule to have new energy efficient windows installed there in the Spring.

If you haven't had a chance to see the old sanctuary area, make a point to check it out. It has been freshly painted and is now the bell/choir/music room. It's been great for choir and bells to have all of their materials in one room and certainly more efficient. There is a plan to build a wall of closets so that our chimes, bells, and other equipment can be stored in a locked area.

Little by little, things are happening. We appreciate your generous support to maintain and update our buildings. **Gifts to our Preservation Fund are always appreciated** and help us to do needed work!

From our FINANCE Team:

We want to express our gratitude for your faithfulness in giving this year. From our weekly offerings to special giving, God's goodness shines through our giving. Being able to fund ministry and mission is an incredible blessing. **At the end of November**, our total income for General Fund for 2021 was \$330,151. Our total General Fund expenses were \$294,567. Our 2021 **Ministry Shares are paid in full**. Praise God!
