REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR MARY IVANOV

New life starts in the dark. Whether it is a seed in the ground, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, it starts in the dark. – Rev. Dr. Barbara Brown Taylor

These words have been an important reminder in this season of Easter. The time I spent at our Prayer Vigil early on Good Friday pausing to pray for many concerns in our lives and in our world grounded me in the reality of suffering. The joy of gathering just after sunrise at Mona Lake reminded me of



the journey of those who went to the tomb and found the surprise of Good News.



This image of the cross at Temple UMC lifted after our Good Friday worship and transformed to help us remember the power of resurrection to offer hope is vital. Repeating the phrase “Christ is risen” has brought comfort. Affirming my faith with “I believe in hope” (Thanks, Ted Lasso!) has been key to claiming that God is working to bring new life even in the midst of death and despair. I pray that God’s greatest surprise bringing you hope, too.


