January Worship News by Karen Booth

"My Story – Faith in Film 2024" - 2024 Worship Theme: "Following the Jesus Way"

Epiphany is a word derived from the Greek for "manifestation" and is usually used as a reminder that Jesus is God's revelation for the whole world. But we also use "epiphany" to describe those moments of deeper understanding and insight – like an "a-ha!" moment. Though our faith in Jesus Christ is grounded in Scripture, the arts, including literature and films, profoundly influence how we think about and understand God. Stories connect to the human experience and help us to grow our faith.

We'll look at four films with the **overall themes of identity**, **discovery**, **and managing expectation (our own and those of others)**. All four movies can be streamed on a variety of platforms and will be shown in their entirety at church for free.

January 7, 2024: "My Story – Following the Jesus Way"

Synopsis: We all have faith stories. Today some will members share theirs.

January 14, 2024: "See for Yourself"

Film: "Jesus Revolution" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aulzCJ7BxtE)

In the 1970s, Greg Laurie and a sea of young people descend on sunny Southern California to redefine truth through all means of liberation. Inadvertently, Laurie meets a charismatic street preacher and a pastor who open the doors to a church to a stream of wandering youth. What unfold is a counterculture movement that becomes the greatest spiritual awakening in American history.

Scripture: John 1: 43-51

Synopsis: Our tendency to separate ourselves from others on the basis of categories we create is sin and denies us the opportunity to see God's grace in other and God's love for the whole world. God calls us to see faith, hope, and love in others – and be strengthened as a community of faith.

January 21, 2024: "We Belong Together" Scripture: I John 4: 17-21; Galatians 3: 26-29 Film: "Elemental" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hXzcyx9V0xw)

Elemental is a story set in Element City, where fire, water, land, and air residents live together. The story introduces Ember, a tough, quick-witted and fiery young woman, whose friendship with a fun, sappy, go-with-the-flow guy named Wade challenges her beliefs about the world they live in.

Synopsis: Differences in cultural identity and experience are a part of our lives. Learning more about one another is a blessing. Differences aren't a reason to fear or separate ourselves from each other. Rather, seeking to understand others is a part of embracing the world God loves.

January 28, 2024: "In the Real World" Scripture: Genesis 1: 1-2, 31; Proverbs 31: 1-9 Film: "Barbie" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pBk4NYhWNMM) Barbie and Ken are having the time of their lives in the colorful and seemingly perfect world of Barbie Land. When Barbie suffers a crisis that leads her to question her world and her existence, and when she and Ken get a chance to go to the real world, they soon discover the joys and perils of living among humans.



Free showing in the sanctuary: Sunday, January 21 at 4:00 p.m.

Synopsis: The formation of identity and the search for meaning and purpose is a shared human experience. We contemplate both the meaning of life and the reality of death, and we seek truth and wisdom about who we are and who we can become. Ultimately, we rest in knowing that we belong to God who offers us salvation in Christ and the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit.



At the end of November 2023, our total income for General Fund was \$350,311 with expenses of \$338,073. We've met all of our financial obligations and are able to support mission and ministry locally and globally. Because of our Faith Commitments for 2024, we're confident in approving a working budget of \$395,453 for 2024, which is approximately a 2% increase over our 2023 budget.
