May 5, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.: Children's Sunday

Synopsis: Today's will celebrate ministry with young people in our congregation and recognize ministries in our church and community. Our High School Youth Mission Team will serve breakfast after worship to raise funds for their summer mission trip.

We begin our series on the Beatitudes in Matthew 5.

May 12, 2024: "Lord, It's Hard to be Humble" *Focus verse:* Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Synopsis: Jesus begins with a call to humility – a sense of how we're called to understand ourselves and

others in light of God's grace. "Poor is spirit" is a challenge to all of us as we fight the power of our ego and recognize our need for God.

May 19, 2024: "Holy Spirit: Our Comfort Keeper" Focus verse: Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Synopsis: With life and love comes pain and grief. If we seek to avoid vulnerability and the risk needed for deeper relationships, we miss out on the blessing of community. The Holy Spirit is sometimes referred to as our Comforter, and Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit reminds us of the promise of comfort.

Today is Pentecost. You are invited to wear red, orange, or yellow as a visual reminder of the day that the Holy Spirit came upon the church.

May 26, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.: "Meek Is Not Weak" Scripture: James 3: 13-18; Colossians 3: 1-14 Focus verse: Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Synopsis: Meekness isn't weakness or passiveness, but is intimately connected to strength and power under control. It's described as "gentle-force" and changes our understanding of what makes for a life of significance and value.

As we prepare to begin a worship series on the Beatitudes of Jesus, you may remember that in that passage, Jesus reminds us that those on his list of who are truly blessed tend to be very different than those that our world generally considers to be the most fortunate. Instead of the rich and powerful, we discover that in God's Kingdom, the blessed are those who mourn, who are poor in spirit, who are persecuted, etc.

I have come to believe that Jesus' list of those who are blessed is a call to all of us to care for those he includes. We might also add to the list by remembering that those who are lonely, who are faced with illness, and who are going through difficult transitions in life are also blessed by him. And when we reach out to them in any way, we become those who Jesus also blesses because of our willingness to show mercy.
