When we live in that truth, we really do feel blessed.

Goals include keeping families with children together in whatever shape or form that family takes, with compassion and without judgment, helping children and their families without a home find permanent, stable housing to end the emergency shelter cycle, and helping parents with life skills that enable them to keep permanent, stable housing for their children.

July 7, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.: "Are We Blessed?"

Focus verse: Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Synopsis: No one wants to suffer. We avoid discomfort and conflict at all costs, but the reality of living our faith is that we will encounter hardship and struggle because following Jesus goes against the expectations of the world. Even so, Jesus pronounces blessing and calls us to be joyful.

July 21, 2024: "Just Show Up!"Scripture: Revelation 3: 1-6, 14-22; Hebrews 6: 9-12Synopsis: Spiritual apathy isn't a new challenge for the church, but we continue to hear the call to show upfor one another as the Body of Christ and a community of faith. Remembering those who have shown upfor us is a powerful reminder of how important it is to engage as followers (not bystanders) of Jesus.

July 28, 2024: "Living with Purpose"Scripture: Romans 12: 1-13; I Timothy 4: 12Synopsis: Having a purpose is a powerful motivator, and we're told that each of has God-given gifts to sharethat matter to God's work in the world. Our HS Youth Mission will share how they used their gifts to serveothers, and we'll be encouraged to do the same.




