
<u>Yard Signs</u> are available as one more way to invite people to worship with us. We'd especially love to put them in high-visibility locations. Please pick one up!

### "Come, Let Us Adore Him"

Advent is a season of anticipation that comes in the midst of life in all its fullness and its messiness. We are wrapped up in so many things, getting so many things done, so many things right, that we can be surprised that the very thing we are planning for actually comes.

Tradition and remembering the songs and stories from our beginnings can be a powerful invitation to grow as disciples as we grow closer to

Scripture: Isaiah 12: 2-6; Luke 3: 7-18

Scripture: Micah 5: 2-5a; Luke 1: 26-55

Christ. Embrace the Presence and Promise of the Christ who comes as we hear the prophets foretell and the Gospels proclaim the power of the Incarnation. And through it all, we will gather to worship. So, come, let us adore him.

### Dec. 1, 2024: "Preparations"

Scripture: Jeremiah 33: 14-16; Luke 21: 25-36 Synopsis: We are people who live in anticipation, who live in hope. It is the essence of our being. So, at the beginning of Advent, we hear the call to pay attention. Our life is a life of fullness and joy, but it is also a preparation for even more fullness – sanctification. Riskier still, we say we are moving on to perfection.

Dec. 8, 2024: "Passion"

Scripture: Malachi 3: 1-4; Luke 3: 1-6 Synopsis: We're called to watch for and notice the ones who "prepare the way" for the coming Messiah, including those whose words convict us of our need for salvation. We may even notice in their words a call to us to be the ones who answer the call to prepare the way with passion.

Mon., Dec. 9, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.: "Mystery of the Christmas Star" at Muskegon Community College's Carr-Fles Planetarium. Sign up at the Welcome Center. If you want a ride, meet at LHUMC at 5:00 p.m.

### Dec. 15, 2024: "Presence"

Synopsis: John the Baptist's words are tough to hear. Something is seriously out of sync. But the message of Advent is that there is hope. Our joy resides in the promise of redemption from our broken world, and John's words call us to be present to and with each other now. Joy is here, not in the denial of the brokenness, but that brokenness is not the last word.

Blue Christmas - Mon., Dec. 16, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.: "Peace"



Scripture: John 1: 1-5

Synopsis: We seek true peace and comfort in this season when it's promised in songs and decorations. Peace of God and comfort in God's care is ours, even as we acknowledge the pain of death, strained relationships, changes in life circumstances,

and other situations.

### Dec. 22, 2024: "Promise"

Synopsis: Mary's "yes" and Elizabeth's faithfulness guide our path, showing that we too have a role to play in bearing God's good news into the world. How will we respond to the invitation to participate in God's promise? How will we share real hope – not simply a wish – but the promise of God fulfilled in Jesus?

Christmas Eve - Tues., Dec. 24, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. & 10:00 p.m.: "Joy"

Scripture: Isaiah 9: 2-7; Luke 2: 1-20

*Synopsis:* The first gift of Christmas, a proclamation from heaven itself, is joy. "I bring you great joy." You aren't required to feel a certain way about it. It's yours, but not yours alone. Emmanuel, God with us, is the great joy for all people.

There will be a short service of candles and carols in the parking lot at 9:00 p.m.

**Dec. 29, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.:** "Home"

Scripture: 1 Samuel 2: 18-20, 26; Luke 2: 15-21

*Synopsis:* Christmas has come and gone and now it is time for everyone to go home – the shepherds, Mary and Joseph, and us too. We go home changed, transformed by the message of the Incarnation – that we are not alone, that we have connection and hope.




### CHILDREN'S CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS...






