January Worship News by Karen Booth

January 5, 2025 at 10:00 a.m.: "Living in the Light of Jesus" Scripture: Isaiah 60: 1-6; Matthew 2: 1-12 Synopsis: Epiphany is a word derived from the Greek for "manifestation" and is usually used as a reminder that Jesus is God's revelation for the whole world. We worship as our witness that God is worthy of our praise – and we seek to follow God's way – led by Jesus, the Light of the World.

There will be a congregational informational meeting after worship in Fellowship Hall. This is an opportunity for our Administrative Council to share the proposed budget and celebrate mission and ministry as we begin a new year.

January 12, 2025: "Living Water" Scripture: Isaiah 43: 1-7, Luke 3: 15-18, 21-23a Synopsis: As we celebrate remember Jesus' baptism, we'll use the beautiful stained-glass window in our sanctuary to remember God's grace in our lives through Scripture.

"Do Unto Others"

Jesus taught that we should treat others as we want them to treat us – including those with whom we disagree. Known as The Golden Rule, a version of this teaching can be found in almost every religion in the world. This holds the power to bring people together again. And this is one of the most important things we can proclaim right now.

January 19, 2025: "Blue and Red Make Purple: Kindness"

Synopsis: Did you know that over 99% of our DNA is the same from one human to another? This surely makes us kin. The word kindness originally developed from a root word that mean "family" or "with the feeling of relatives for each other." We begin this series considering the implications of spending so much of our time feeling estranged from, and resentful toward, those whose less than 1% moves them in a different direction from us. And we begin to dream of finding a "purple space" in which to exchange goodness.

January 26, 2025: "The Polarization Within: Compassion"

Scripture: Isaiah 11: 6-9 Synopsis: Because we are complex beings living in a complex world, we sometimes deal with conflict within us in addition to the conflict between us. Research tells us that because we humans are desperate for a sense of cohesion and belonging in these confusing times, we are hanging onto ideological generalities instead of treating ourselves and each other with the compassion required to alleviate despair. Compassion grows when we are able to know ourselves and one another on a deeper level and act out of understanding.

From our FINANCE Team: Thank you for your faithful giving this year! We're so grateful for God's faithfulness in leading us in generosity. At the end of November 2024, our total income for General Fund was \$371,008 with expenses of \$347,254. We've met all of our financial obligations and are able to support mission and ministry locally and globally. Because of our Faith Commitments for 2025, we're

confident in approving a working budget of \$411,030 for 2025, which is an increase of approximately 4% over our 2024 budget. A copy of the proposed budget – both a numbers budget and a narrative budget – will be available at the beginning of January.

The Work of Christmas by Howard Thurman
