February Worship News by Karen Booth

Feb. 2, 2025: "Listen More, Speak Less: Humility"

Scripture: Ephesians 4: 1-6 Synopsis: The root of the word "human" is the same as the word "humility." It all means literally "on the ground." From dust we came, and to dust we shall return. When we hear each other's fears, anxieties, and pain, we can return to the ground of hope - that we are all experiencing the pains of being human. This week we remember to look first at our neighbor as a person, not a position. Beginning conversations this way may help us to stay human and "on the ground" with one another rather than needing to come out on top.

Feb. 9, 2025: "Living Together on Uncommon Ground: Respect" Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12: 1-26 Synopsis: "R.E.S.P.EC.T., find out what it means to me," so sang Aretha Franklin. And she convinced us that it means a lot. Sometimes we think having respect means to agree or be the same. But that is not actually the depth of what respect is about. It comes from the Latin respectus which means "the act of looking at one often, to consider, to observe." We are called to respect by tending to one another – regarding each other, considering each other – early and often. As we live on uncommon ground (because the reality is that common ground is sometimes not possible), what can we do to keep tending to one another as "kin" worthy of respect despite our differences?

Feb. 16, 2025: "Malice toward None: Love"

Synopsis: Loving our neighbors – including relatives, coworkers, acquaintances, strangers – as ourselves is no simple task. We need God. We need the love of God to show us mercy and strength to love as God loves. We need the story of Jesus – the one who loved across the lines that had been drawn in the society of his day but who also stood up for the least and the lost. We need faith that no matter the strain of differing positions, policies, and politics, we will move forward in love. Disagreeing need not be antithetical to love and grace. And indeed, our world depends on all of us working for a better world filled with more kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love.

Feb. 23, 2025: "Making Room for Peace"

Scripture: John 20: 19-23; Luke 6: 37-38 Synopsis: The theme of "doing unto others" is needed now more than ever. Lest anxiety, fear, unrealistic expectations, or resentment take the upper hand as we deal with this traumatic time of division, let us focus on the only thing we can control – how we treat one another. How we care for one another. And this task requires the enlarging of our hearts.



From our FINANCE Team: We're so thankful to report that we've been to support ministry and mission for another year! **At the end of December and the end of 2024,** our total income for General Fund was \$414,417. Our total General Fund expenses were \$388,428. All bills and Ministry Shares were paid in full.

Our 2025 budget is \$411,030, which is an increase from 2024 – about 4%. We're confident that we can support this budget because of God's faithfulness and generosity through our giving – and because of your Faith Commitments. It's never too late to write yours down and send it in! This is one way that we are accountable to God and to our congregation together. LAKE HARBOR UMC FINANCE COMMITTEE - 2025 NARRATIVE BUDGET

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ! Finance Committee's purpose is two-fold.

- 1. We seek to **ensure that all of the church's short-term financial obligations are met** including paying our pastor's salary and benefits, keeping lights on and heating the building, covering the cost of church and parsonage maintenance, funding staff positions and ministry areas, and meeting our connectional obligations such as Ministry Shares.
- 2. We are charged with **securing the long-term financial stability of the church.** You'll see elements of both of these responsibilities in this narrative budget. Information described here is available as a line item budget to anyone seeking additional details.

Our 2025 budget reflects a 4% increase from 2024. Our financial picture is stable, and we celebrate God's faithfulness and generosity. We've seen an increase in pledges for 2025, and we feel confident that we've prepared a realistic budget while knowing that it's a faith budget until gifts are given. We rely on you - our members and regular attenders - to faithfully contribute financially and to be engaged in mission and ministry that these funds support.

2024 offered the blessing of a gift from a fund set up by an anonymous donor through the Community Foundation of Muskegon County. We received \$52,030, which made it possible for us to further mission and ministry. We have a policy to ensure that this annual distribution is not used for operational expenses, but allows us to support new ministries and enhance our work together. In 2024, funds supported an update to our website, new equipment for Praise Team, Lent books for our young families, new appliances for our kitchen, bean bags for our Education events, our monthly commitment to Supper House, a food truck during Vacation Bible School, and a petting zoo for our outdoor ministry.

We are thankful for consistent financial giving that supports our general budget needs, and we're aware of giving that goes beyond this budget like noisy offerings, special appeals, and "soft giving" that can never be counted.

We celebrate that we met all of our financial obligations in 2024, including paying 100% of Ministry Shares to both the Michigan Conference and our Western Waters District. We supported many mission projects – both local and global - including Mission for Area People (MAP) Food Pantry and Medical Fund, UMCOR, CROP Walk, Muskegon Rescue Mission, Family Promise of the Lakeshore, Kids Belong First Place, Hope Project, and Reach the Forgotten jail ministry. We're excited to be a part of God's work in Muskegon and around the world!

INCOME: Though we create a budget based on pledges and some projection, it is always a "faith" budget. The 2025 general fund budget is based on anticipated income from pledges, other regular giving, and additional income.

EXPENSES are expected to be **\$411,030** with requests collected from all ministry areas. Dollar figures are totals within that budget category. Figures in parentheses represent percentage of the total budget projected for 2025.

<u>Ministerial Support</u>: \$106,799 (26%) This includes our pastor's salary, retirement, and health insurance, as well as mileage and professional expense reimbursement. Pastor Mary's health insurance is covered largely under her spouse's policy. This number also includes a discretionary fund that the pastor uses to help our church family and community members when there are special needs.

Staff Salary and Support: \$157,615 (38.3%) This is the total for salary and wages for our Youth Director, Financial Secretary, Administrative Assistant, Treasurer, Organist, Celebration Music Director, Choir Director, Choir Accompanist, Bell Choir Director, Nursery staff, Children's Christian Education Director, Congregational Care Coordinator, and a stipend for our Worship Coordinators. Our custodial needs are contracted, and this expense is also included.

<u>Administration and Communications:</u> \$18,550 (4.5%) The copy machine, office equipment maintenance costs, office supplies, postage, website maintenance, as well as financial ministry costs (giving envelopes and online giving fees) are included in this amount.

<u>Church Building and Maintenance</u>: \$65,200 (15.9%) In this category are projected costs for heat, electricity, water, snowplowing and lawn care. Costs for maintaining and repairing equipment, maintenance supplies, parsonage maintenance and insurance costs are included here as well. There is a line for special projects that need to be completed in order to keep our physical space safe and welcoming and a line for the cost of small repairs and maintenance, as well as a line to support Memorial Garden upkeep.

<u>Music and Worship</u>: \$5,971 (1.5%) Offering meaningful worship services carries some cost, including basics like supplying music, maintaining instruments, purchasing licenses to play music and media and project lyrics, and buying images, media, and Communion supplies. We also pay a fee to livestream worship. Our Worship Connections Team has other costs to offer meaningful worship services, including software to create images, take-away items, and a portion of the cost of a planning retreat, which has been a great addition to our ministry and mission to make disciples.

<u>Christian Education, Youth Ministries, and Outreach</u>: \$18,600 (4.5%) We are deeply grateful for paid staff and many faithful servants who teach and mentor all ages in our church, and we are excited to be able to support them with curriculum and teaching aids. This includes ministry for infants through adults, Vacation Bible School, Bibles for kids and youth, devotional materials, luncheons for our 80+ members and friends, and hospitality costs. Having resources to support nurture and outreach is an incredible blessing.

<u>Missions:</u> \$2,500 (0.6%) Much of our "second mile" giving comes through noisy offerings and special appeals, but these funds are available to meet needs in our community and beyond, including special requests for needy families from community partners.

Ministry Shares: \$35,795 (8.7%) John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, provides the rationale for Ministry Shares: "Do all the good you can, by all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." Connectional giving that supports Muskegon Methodist Ministries, our Western Waters District, Michigan Conference, and larger UMC is a vital part of our life together because we can do much more together than we can apart. Ministry Shares are calculated based on a percentage of a church's expenses. We strive to pay a portion of these each month so we meet the obligation before year's end.

Thank you for your generosity and faithful giving to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.
