



REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR MARY IVANOV



A few years ago, when we did an exercise about what to “give up” for Lent, I was challenged to give up apathy. That made an impression on me, so that has become an important part of my spiritual discipline during Lent and beyond it. I’m thankful that our Michigan Conference encourages us to become more active in putting our faith into action at Advocacy Day. **Since 2023, United Methodists and friends have gathered at the Michigan Capitol** to focus on important issues like common sense gun laws, mental health care support, and fixing no-fault auto insurance laws. We take time to learn about the issues and then meet and talk with our respective legislators about them. This has helped me to become more comfortable calling their offices when I want to act and advocate.



This year, I also **spent time in prayer in the rotunda** amid many people walking around, including 4th graders who were on a field trip to learn more about state government. Tour guides encourage them to lay on their backs and see the dome, including the gold stars that symbolize the potential and hope for our state. **As we walk the rest of this Lenten journey, I pray that we’ll keep praying and working for the Kingdom of God where faith, hope, and love are our deepest values. Make a plan to participate in Holy Week worship opportunities as we seek to follow Jesus more closely and keep our focus on his call on our lives.**

April 6, 2025: “Extending the Table”

Scripture: Luke 14: 1-24

Synopsis: We want the best seat at the table, but Jesus invites us to make room and offer hospitality to others as an act of grace – and encourages us to be humble, generous, and responsive as we approach our spiritual lives.

April 13, 2025: “Cries of the Heart”

Scripture: Luke 19: 28-40; Psalm 118: 1-2, 19-29; Luke 23: 32-43

Synopsis: From excited expectation of the crowds to a persistent plea from a common criminal, we walk with Jesus in highest joy and deepest sorrow as he is hailed as part of a protest-parade and then as things move quickly to his arrest, trial, and death. We’re invited to hear the heart cries of the people Jesus encounters – and add our own heart cries as we journey all the way.

Holy Thursday, April 17, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.: “One Who Serves”

Scripture: Luke 22: 1-27

Synopsis: Jesus is eager to share a meal with his closest followers.

Join us for a **potluck style meal at 6:00 pm** at the back of the sanctuary. We will share **finger food** similar to what Jesus and his disciples shared on this night: nuts, dried and fresh fruit, bread, crackers, cheese, hard boiled eggs, olives, vegetables, etc. Bring a dish to share; nothing too messy (please) as we only have silverware for serving, not eating. Water and table service provided.

8:30 p.m. Thursday – 11:30 a.m. Friday: Prayer Vigil

This is a powerful opportunity to offer the gift of time to God in prayer – prayers for ourselves, our church, community, and world, and especially those concerns that are gathered up for the vigil that might never be voiced aloud in worship. April 20, 2025: “Look for the Living”

Scripture: Luke 24: 1-12; Psalm 118: 1-2, 14-24

Synopsis: What no one thought was possible happened. The women who went to the tomb to care for Jesus in death found a word of life and hope. Even though it seemed like “you had to be there” to believe it, the good news of resurrection spread, and we can rejoice and be glad!

April 27, 2025: “Jesus, Our True Companion”

Scripture: Luke 24: 13-35

Synopsis: The word “companion” means “one who breaks bread with another.” Jesus’ presence is fully realized when he breaks bread with those who are walking home from Jerusalem, and they go back and share their experience with others. In the sacrament of Holy Communion and in the sacramental moments of our lives, Christ is present.

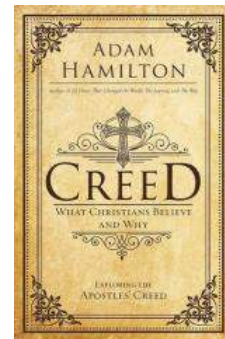

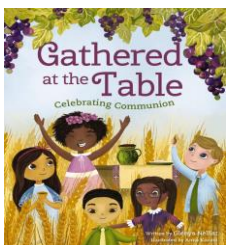


CHILDREN'S CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS...

lit up the sky around us with the Northern Lights! What an amazing time in such a magical place!



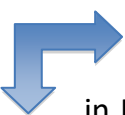

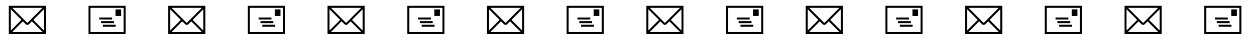
