### June Worship News by Karen Booth

June 1, 2025: "Be the Church"

Scripture: I Corinthians 12: 12-14, 27-30

Synopsis: Why do we describe the church as holy (set apart) and catholic (universal)? We are a gathered community of people seeking to follow Jesus Christ – actively loving God and loving neighbor through worship and mission by the power of the Holy Spirit.

June 8, 2025: "The Forgiveness of Sins"

Scripture: Acts 2: 1-4; Matthew 6: 9-17

*Synopsis:* Why does it matter that we believe in "forgiveness of sins"? Rather than being a guilt trip, confession reminds us that God is faithful to forgive. The prayer Jesus teaches (and invites us to pray) shows that forgiveness is central to our faith in him.

Today is *Pentecost*. You are invited to dress in red, orange, or yellow.

**June 15, 2025:** "Resurrection and Life" with Rev. Kim Bos *Scripture:* John 11: 17-27; II Corinthians 5: 1-5 *Synopsis:* What happens when we die? Most of us have probably thought about it — and maybe even worried and wondered about it. We trust in the hope of God's promise that physical death is not the end of the story, but that there is life in heaven with God — and life with God now.



### "Busy"

Life can be crazy busy. In order to continue our work of caring for others, we need to find a rhythm that allows us to thrive – find a balance between work, play, rest, and reflection. One antidote to busyness is prayer. This series invites us to practices of

making room, clearing out, slowing down, and prioritizing for the sake of holistic lives.

June 22, 2025: "Preparing a Table" with Rev. Georgia Hale

Scripture: Psalm 23

Synopsis: The 23<sup>rd</sup> psalm is a great comfort to us as we imagine the green pastures and still waters. It also recalls the dark valleys and calls us into the not-so-easy practice of sitting down at the table with our enemies. An unhurried God is present with us in the good times and in the difficult times and invites us to be radically present to each other in the same way. Have we been too busy to be really present to one another?

June 29, 2025: "Give It a Rest"

Scripture: Mark 2: 21-28; Exodus 20: 8; Psalm 46: 10

The commandment to keep the Sabbath is one that might not seem as important as the one about not murdering. But what and who, suffers in our society when we value economic security over well-being?

We are implementing a Prayer Pal program so that each child and teen at Lake Harbor will have an adult assigned to pray for them.

You can sign up to be a Prayer Pal. You will be assigned a child (birth through age 17) as a Prayer Pal within a couple weeks after signing up. You will be given a little information about your Prayer Pal that may guide you in your prayer. This is a one-year commitment to pray. Offering to pray for someone is a free and powerful gift.



#### **CONGREGATIONAL CARE NEWS** from Pastor Mark Erbes

As a way to more fully participate in our current worship series on the Apostles' Creed, I have been rereading Adam Hamilton's book *Creed*, which offers an excellent summary of what we believe as reflected in those familiar words that we say in worship or prayer. My favorite chapter in the book is the one that discusses the line "we believe in the holy catholic church and the communion of saints". In it, Hamilton stresses that the whole idea of sainthood and holiness "reflects both a present reality and future calling." In other words, we are all called to be saints today and every day, and the future of the church depends on our understanding and living out that reality. And then he goes on to describe "ordinary saints" like us as those "who pay attention each day, watching for moments when God needs (us) to reach out to someone who needs care."

In those words, I can think of no better description of what congregational care really is. For this type of care begins with us paying attention to those around us within our church and community so that we know

when a helping hand and heart is what they need from us. For as a wise pastoral counseling professor once said to me, "If you don't see them, you can't help them!"

In that spirit, I hope that we are all paying attention to those members of our church family so that we might sense the needs that they may have. For often, those who are hurting or lonely are hesitant to share that with others. And if you are feeling a call to the kind of "ordinary sainthood" that reaches out to those folks, please feel free to talk to me, Pastor Mary, or any member of our Congregational Care Team or Membership, Nurture, and Outreach (MNO) Committee in order to become a part of those ministries in any ways that you can.


