REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR MARY IVANOV

As a part of our **C3 (Courageous Congregations Collaborative)** work, our team has been working through five “muscles” that we’re flexing as we seek God’s will and follow God’s way. This process is particularly focused on how we are **being the church in a post-Covid world**. C3 is rooted in spiritual and strategic discernment and looks at culture change in the church.

One of the five muscles is **Expanding Imagination – thinking about people who can teach us something new, opening ourselves up to the community around us, and becoming more aware of what God is already doing - and how we can partner.** (On a personal note, participating in Dancing with the Local Stars was definitely an opportunity to do this for me – to learn something new, meet new people, and recognize the myriad of gifts and hearts for service that are all around us!) Our C3 Team has discussed how we can increase our partnerships with other churches and community resources, and there are exciting possibilities for how we can grow relationships with people close to us in Norton Shores.

The season of Lent invites us to expand our imagination and become more aware of God’s presence as we engage in worship and spiritual disciplines like prayer, Bible study, and opportunities to serve and grow in God’s grace and love. **Expanding our imaginations encourages us to nurture our relationship with God and one another** – with the hope and promise that we’ll be transformed in the process!

May this season be a time for all of us to be transformed into more faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

March Worship News by Karen Booth

March 1: “How Many Times?” *Peter and the Uncertainty of Forgiveness* Scripture: Matthew 18: 21-35
Synopsis: Jesus’ teachings on forgiveness (and our questions about it) help us understand how God forgives us, how we can forgive others, and the relationship between the two.

March 8: “Don’t Worry about Anything” *The Crowd and the Uncertainty of Worry* Scripture: Luke 12: 13-34
Synopsis: The sayings of Jesus about the lilies of the field and sparrows of the air are a central teaching on trusting God and overcoming anxiety in the face of our worries by focusing on what we experience right now, rather than trying to accumulate more to insulate ourselves from the certainty of physical death.

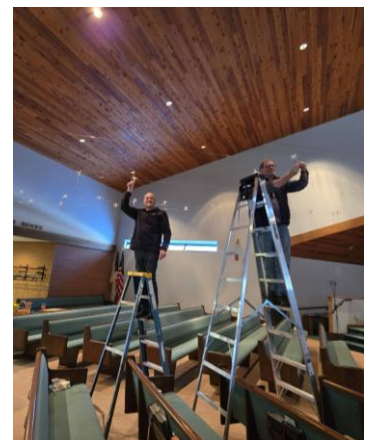
March 15: “He Will Rise Again” *Lazarus and the Uncertainty of Mortality* Scripture: John 11: 1-44
Synopsis: Our culture doesn’t do a very good job of dealing with death. How can we confront our fears with God’s help like Mary and Martha did - and be willing to answer Jesus’ call to step into the freedom of new life?

March 22: “You Come Down!” *Zacchaeus and the Uncertainty of Surrender* Scripture: Luke 19: 1-10
Synopsis: How can we nurture true connection to Jesus? Zacchaeus reminds us of our desire to see and to be seen – and the transformation that happens when we seek to know Christ – including offering ourselves in service to God.

March 29: “Save Us!” *Jesus and the Uncertainty of Praise, Power, and Pride – Palm Sunday*
Scripture: Matthew 21: 1-11; Psalm 118: 19-29; Philippians 2: 1-11
Synopsis: Today is a day for joy in the promise of salvation. As we journey with Jesus to the cross – the journey then and now – we find our joy in the promise of salvation, a promise that will not fail. So, when we’re stuck between the truth of sin and the promise of salvation, we proclaim God’s steadfast love.

Holy Week begins, and we’ll prepare our hearts throughout the next week with **Holy Thursday on April 2**, our annual **Prayer Vigil** on Thursday night into Friday morning, and **Good Friday** on April 3.

Have you seen the **amazing visuals** that our Worship Connections Team created for the season of Lent? It takes a lot of people, time, and work to get it done, but we’re grateful for their dedication to prepare our worship space for different series and seasons. And **thanks to everyone who helped to unhang the greens** too!

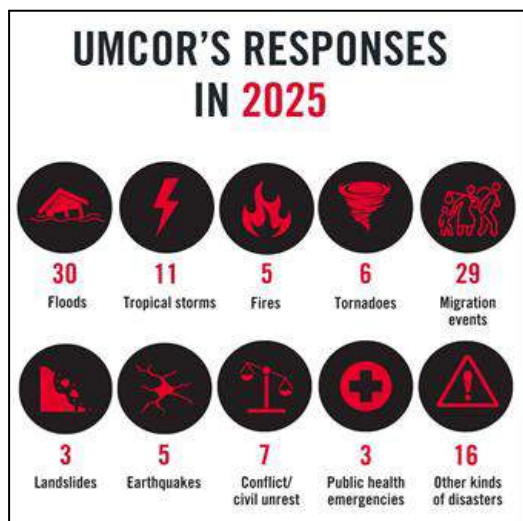

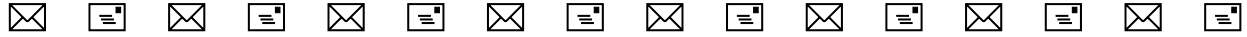
