Our **C3 Team** continues to move forward in learning about the five adaptive leadership muscles that we can build together:

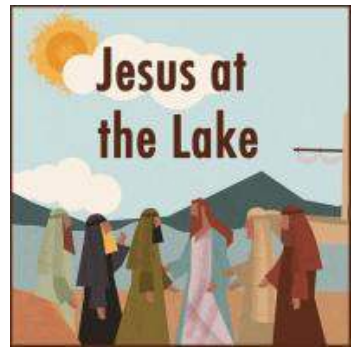
- Tending Grief** encourages us to acknowledge loss with honesty.

June 7, 2026: "A New Kind of Fishing"

Scripture: Luke 5: 1-11

Synopsis: Many people like fishing today, but in most areas, there are fewer who make a living from it. When Jesus spoke of "fishing for people," that image made a lot of sense to many who heard him. Jesus called people to change their work, habits, attitudes or beliefs, relationships, and even their understanding of life's ultimate purpose. Where is God calling you to change something? Will you respond?

June 14, 2026: "In the Wind and Waves"

Scripture: Mark 4: 35-41

Synopsis: Jesus calming a storm is a powerful example of his power to save in the midst of chaos. How do we grow in our trust in him – knowing that he is present – and hearing his call to faith?

June 21, 2026: "Faith in Rough Waters"

Scripture: Matthew 14: 22-33

Synopsis: After the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus sends his disciples across the Sea of Galilee in a boat, while he heads to a mountain to pray. Jesus approaches the disciples' boat in the middle of a storm, walking on the rough sea, and calming their fear. How do we understand that God can show up, even when we don't recognize him? How do we hold onto the promise that God never leaves us, always cares about what we're going through, and sometimes calms the child, not the storm?

Scripture: Luke 8: 26-38

Synopsis: Jesus meets a man from whom everyone else wants to run away. Forces haunting this man, whatever their exact nature, brought him no good. He was alone and without community. Jesus cares and heals – and restores him to community. No wonder the man wanted to stay with Jesus! Any kind of healing, any good thing God gives us, is never just for our sake. How will we engage in Jesus' ministry and "go and tell"?

We Need a Hero: The Bible is quite willing to extol heroes. Some of those people did highly lamentable and sinful things, but we honor them, as we honor all heroes, not *because* they did things that deserve condemnation, but *despite* the fact that they did them. How can their courage, fortitude, sacrifice, and above all, faithfulness, inspire us? We’ll use three recent films as the jumping off point for our series.

Spiritual Wilderness: The Israelites wandered through the wilderness in search of the Promised Land. Like the Israelites, we can feel like we are in a spiritual wilderness. God seems to be absent. We spend ages wandering around alone, going nowhere. 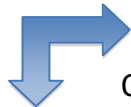

Ross Park Readers were celebrated on Children’s Sunday! **Andrea Goodburn, a Ross Park teacher and member of LHUMC, offered this reflection in worship:**

“What you are doing matters more than you probably realize. Not only to students but is also a big help to our staff.

In my classroom, I have Ms. Janet (Skok). She comes once a week, usually for about an hour. She has become a special part of our classroom community.

My students ask when she’s coming. They get excited on the days she’s there. She is always greeted with hugs.

As a special education teacher, I was a little unsure at first what this would look like.

My classroom has a range of needs, including behavior needs and many students on communication devices, and I didn’t know how that would go with a volunteer coming in. Ms. Janet has been patient and flexible with my students. She meets them where they are.

And it’s not just my classroom. You’ll see Ross Park Readers all throughout the building. In the hallways working one on one with students. In classrooms supporting small groups.

My own son, Axl, has a Ross Park Reader who pulls him to work on reading. So I get to see this from both sides, as a teacher and as a parent. I see the impact in my classroom, and I see the impact on Axl’s classroom benefiting from that extra time, that extra attention, and that connection with someone from our community.

That’s what makes this program so special. It’s not just about academics. It’s about relationships. It’s about kids feeling known, supported, and encouraged.

If you are already a Ross Park Reader, thank you. And if you’ve ever thought about joining, there is a place for you. We can find a classroom that fits what you’re comfortable with, whether that’s working one on one, leading a small group, or just being another supportive adult in the room. We would love to have you. Thank you for investing in our kids. It truly matters.”

We’re winding down for the school year, but we’ll be back in the fall. **Look for more information about a interest meeting in August.** Contact Pastor Mary if you’re interested in learning more.
